Expectations

This course enables students to enhance their knowledge of the French language and to further develop their language skills through the study of twentieth-century francophone literature and culture. Students will participate in oral communication, reading and writing activities as they study selected authentic poems, legends, songs, films and newspaper articles intended for French-speaking audience. **Because I am very much dedicated to the visible improvement of your son's/daughter's ability in French, I ask that your child takes an active role in his/her learning experience by speaking only French while in this class.**

Specific Expectations

By the end of this course, students will have developed new skills and knowledge of French in the following categories: oral and written comprehension and oral and written production. They will be able to discuss ideas and opinions relating to topics being studied; gather information for different purposes and from a variety of sources and apply it in other contexts; write in a variety of forms, adjusting the language to suit the audience; understand simple statements spoken in the accent or idiom of various French-speaking regions; identify and use appropriate language conventions during oral, reading and writing activities; and gain an understanding of French-speaking cultures.
